

**Beyond Divides:
An International Winter School and Forum on Contemporary Agri-food Issues
12-22 November 2012
Barcelona, Spain**



The Marie Curie Initial Training Network PUREFOOD¹ project team will host a winter school and forum in Barcelona from 12-22 November. The forum will be a highly collaborative and interdisciplinary event, with the joint participation of the PUREFOOD research fellows and supervisory team, a diverse group of external Ph.D. students, and respected local and international scholars and practitioners. The forum will create an atmosphere of debate, exchange, and collaboration. The academic program will feature three distinct learning modes – expert-led discussions, peer-led paper review, and thematically integrated site visits – and will include modules oriented to some of the most prominent themes in agri-food system scholarship today.

Information for Applicants

Admission to the international winter school and forum is on a competitive basis. Student applications will be assessed based on motivation and ability to contribute actively to group discussions and peer learning. Applications from students possessing a wide range of experience and interdisciplinary knowledge are particularly welcomed. Please ensure that your application clearly indicates your motivation for participating and what you believe you could contribute to the group discussions.

Aimed at: Ph.D. students engaged in research around and interested in actively participating in the debates central to contemporary agri-food discourse and practice

Language: The language of the school will be English; any presentations in Spanish/Catalan will be translated into English.

Paper Requirement

To encourage peer learning, enhance critical discussion and review skills, and provide the opportunity to learn from and with other students, each student will be required to submit a paper (written in English) of between 5,000 and 7,000 words; this may be, for example, a well-progressed article that the student is currently working on or has recently completed. This paper is not due with your application, but should be submitted by 21 October 2012. Each paper will be presented by the author to the group; this will be followed by a formal critique by two peers who will have read the paper carefully and prepared feedback to be delivered in written form and orally at the peer paper review session(s). Students will be required to act as reviewers for two peer papers.

Fees

The €600 registration fee covers:

- Seminars and teaching sessions
- Cultural/educational visits and activities
- Transportation for excursions and off-site lectures
- Lunches (excluding Sunday 18 November)

* Not included in the registration fee: Student's travel to Barcelona, visas, accommodation, meals and subsistence not mentioned above, the optional winery/agritourism visit, and any other incidental costs.

* Students are responsible for arranging their own travel and accommodations.

4. Assignment of review pairs by the Winter School Organizing Committee and distribution of papers to be reviewed by students on 1 November 2012
